Extend the experience by offering black or blue construction paper and star stickers to create constellations, drawing the lines between stars with a white crayon or chalk. If your child is especially interested in astronomy, visit the library to check out books about stars or research constellations together on the Internet.

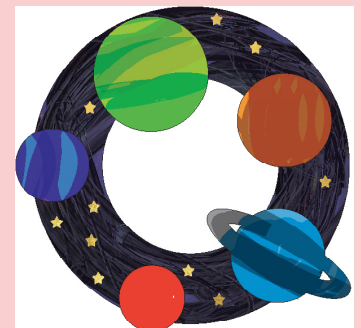
Snow Globe Sensory Bottle
